Finding Healing in a Supportive Community

When Angela needed to escape unhealthy family relationships, she turned to St. Vincent de Paul for help while she looked for a fresh start.

With the help of case managers and staff there, she found employment through Goodwill. “It feels great having the community here where I can grow and accomplish goals,” she says. “I have grown in my self-confidence. Out here, they are helping me build myself back up.”

A New Baby, A New Life

Andrea had to quit her job as a dental hygienist when she began having pregnancy complications. She lost her income, then her apartment. She had support from her ex, until he suffered a bad stroke and ended up in a nursing home. Her baby was born prematurely, and the complications resulted in Andrea having a full hysterectomy. While she recovered, her newborn son spent 79 days in the NICU.

After all these struggles, Andrea is still determined to return to work and provide a better life for her four children. A case worker helped her find a new apartment and equip her with essentials like a car seat and Pack and Play for the baby, and beds for her children. With the help of St. Vincent de Paul Conferences, Andrea was able to pay her old utility bills and transfer services to her new apartment. Now she has what she needs to get her family back on track.
