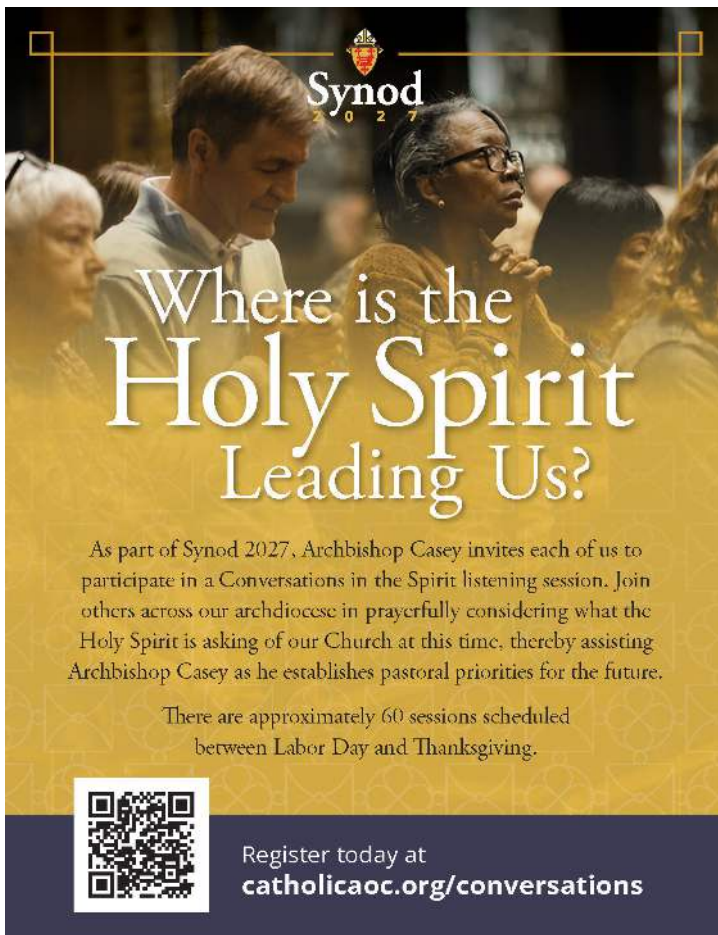
This is a mobile meal program (groceries for neighbors in need) for the parish community and the Belmont Neighborhood held every third Wednesday of the month. All are welcome!

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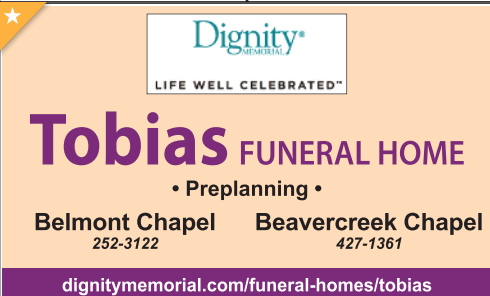
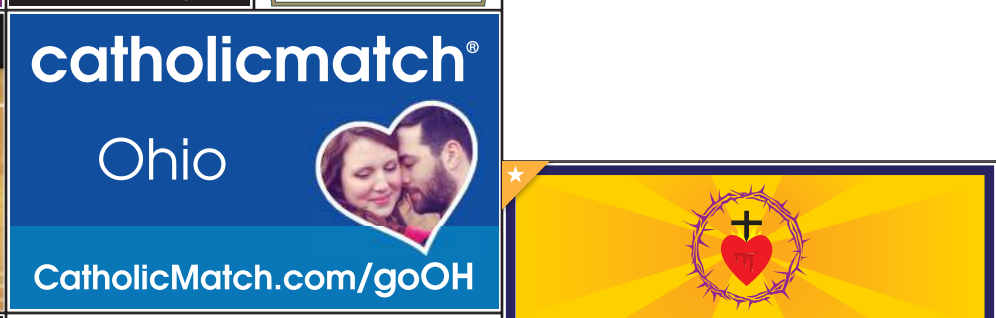

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Bread of Life/Pan de Vida Family of Parishes Update

Since the Fall of 2025 there has been a flurry of events and activities around the Beacons of Light Process for the Bread of Life/Pan de Vida Family of Parishes. We have shared news about some of these activities. The Year 3 Family Pathway report was shared in November 2025 along with our new vision statement, observations, challenges, insights and highlights. It also provided updated Pastoral Planning Principles showing progress and planning. We shared information about becoming one canonical parish and information from the Bread of Life Family of Parishes pastoral report submitted to the archdiocese. In this letter, I would like to give you a more comprehensive update.

Family Unity Discernment

In January 2026, under the leadership of Archbishop Robert Casey, the Center for Parish Vitality has undertaken the task of facilitating a Family Unity Discernment process for all the deaneries. In this process, an entire deanery with all the parishes within the deanery would gather for *Conversations in the Spirit*. These conversations are conducted in the Synodal style – meaning, that are conducted not in the style of town meetings to focus on problem solving or to vote on issues but as a prayerful process of being attentive to God’s promptings and to listen to each other. The eleven parishes in the Dayton/Emmanuel deanery gathered under one roof to experience the synodal style or conversations and to discern and plan for individual family of parish level family unity discernment session.

Family of Parishes Family Unity Discernment

Towards this goal, the Bread of Life/Pan de Vida Parish Leadership Team and the Family of Parish Pastoral Council members were invited to attend the Family Unity Discernment Day 1 on April 11, 2026. Following this gathering, every parishioner of the Bread of Family of Parishes was invited to the family of Parish level Reflect Saturday Synod on May 2, 2026. Altogether 91 people responded to the invitation and met in groups from 9am to 3pm. In the morning besides presenting a synopsis of the synodal method of conversations, data regarding parishioner registrations, religious education, sacraments, (Mass baptisms, First Holy Communions, Confirmations) funerals, financial health, deferred maintenance, capital campaigns and other relevant aspects of the parishes were present. In the afternoon, *Conversations in the Spirit* were held in small groups.

Conversations in the Spirit addressed three questions:

- a) How do I understand the mission Christ entrusted to the Church? What new ministries or capabilities would best server this mission?
- b) What tradeoffs should we make and are willing to make to reallocate scarce resources (priests, deacons, buildings, people, financial) to server the future mission?
- c) What is the best use of Family resources (priests, deacons, buildings, people, finances) to which the Holy Spirit is calling our family of parishes?

The conversations were recorded and the notes were submitted to the Center for Pastoral Vitality. They were summarized into points. Five area emerged as the focal points of the conversations – communication, family identity, organizational structure, evangelization, and outreach and stewardship.

These five focal points can be summarized under the following points:

- First, whereas communication is shared on multiple platforms there is always room for improvement. The common website, which is under development, will help with this.
- Second, a greater need to foster a common identity for the five parishes within the family of parishes was expressed. We need to acknowledge what is working and continue the momentum. Stronger together should be our motto. More vibrant common celebrations and an emphasis on unity over individual identity could help. Clearly, we need to focus on moving from maintenance to mission.

- Third, there is urgent need for organizational restructuring that meets not just the needs of individual parishes but the Family of Parishes as a whole. We need to do this by recognizing that all parishes are on tight/break even budgets. Parishes with savings will retain these assets for future needs of their location. This calls for planning for the best use of resources – finances, facilities, staff, priests and people. Organizational restructuring requires staff reorganization, hiring new personnel, and addressing challenges from deferred maintenance at some campuses.
- Fourth, for greater effectiveness of our evangelization efforts we need to streamline programming and events to better serve the mission. There was overwhelming support for building a culture of common and shared events such as Triduum, Holy Day Masses/celebrations, Family of Parishes retreats, faith formation, and social events. To this end, a need was identified to hire a Coordinator for Evangelization and Programming.
- The fifth focal point was Outreach and Stewardship. It was recognized that while supporting diversity and diverse activities within the Family of Parishes, we should embrace our common family identity. We can accomplish this by developing strategies, creating opportunities to live out the vision statement of the Bread of Life, Pan de Vida Family of Parishes.

The above results were presented to the Family of Parishes Pastoral Council.

Three Initiatives for 2026-27

The next step in the Family Unity Discernment process is for each Family of Parishes to submit three initiatives to the Archbishop that stem from the Family Unity Discernment process. This is to be done in conversation with the Family Leadership Team and the Family of Parishes Pastoral Council. The three areas that have been determined are:

- a) Schools Strategic Planning for Holy Angels, St. Helen and Immaculate Conception. The goal here is to plan for our schools into the future. Parent surveys and representative focus groups will be integral to strategic planning.
- b) Organization and Administrative Restructuring
Becoming one canonical parish will require the bringing together of financial and administrative responsibilities. The key here is to look at all our resources and determine the best use of our resources to move from maintenance to Mission.
- c) Faith Formation and Evangelization
A Family of Parishes retreat is planning for October 24, 2026. The day will focus on the Bread of Life discourse in the gospel of John. The retreat will be the beginning of consorted and planned effort toward formation and evangelization. To this purpose, all faith formation, Bible study, faith-sharing groups, and religious education programs are being invited to focus on Pope Leo XIV's encyclical, *Magnifica Humanitas*, in order to create a spiritual bond between our parishes.

Meanwhile, may I request you to mark two dates on your calendar:

- **September 12, 2026**, the Bread of Life Family of Parishes Picnic will begin with Mass at 4 pm at Delco Park, followed by an evening of food and fellowship.
